Advisory Happening:

Today we took the all-school picture and advisory photo. Students led days continue in advisory. Jerry Yang took us into the gym for a game of soccer last week which was great fun!

<u>Student Led conferences</u>: Our portfolio work continues this week. Each student in the Polaris community maintains a portfolio of work and leads a conference twice a year for their family and their advisor. We have been using our advisory time to work on our portfolios. We are making some changes this year to the requirements of portfolios so check in with your student to learn about these changes. Students are aligning their work samples from each class to the State Content and District Common Core Standards. Students each have a copy in their portfolio and these documents can also be found online on the ASD website: www.asdk12.org/commoncore

Following this link will also take you to the Parent Road Maps. These road maps help parents understand how to support their child in math and language arts. Each road map lets parents know what their child will learn, how to partner with the teacher, provides examples of skills and strategies students will use and how to ensure learning continues outside of school.

The conference sign-up is up, see attached pdf and email me if you don't see your student's name on the list. As I mentioned in the last update, on Wednesday Oct. 24th or Thursday October 25th you and your student will come spend a half hour with me. <u>Your student comes only for their</u> <u>conference</u>, there is no regular school Wednesday the 24th or Thursday 25th and Friday the 26th is an in-service day so please plan accordingly.

<u>Second Semester Scheduling</u>: We will be doing credit checks the week after conferences to prepare for course selection for 2nd semester. On the 29th of October, your student will have a course request form and the second semester schedule and intensive catalogs will be posted on the website. Course request forms are due back to me by November the 6th. On November 6th all Polaris Advisories will meet 3rd, 4th and 5th hour for the purpose of completing credit checks and course requests. Students will be placed in Winter intensives by November 12th and Scholarship applications will be due November 14th. All winter intensive fees will be due before Thanksgiving.

<u>New School Business partner</u>
